As the bat weather, combined with rough tripsportation, The not weather, combined with rough transportation, and sometimes imperfect sealing, produces fermenta-tion, and consequent loss of the fruit. Currants dried with a small proportion of sugar, thout 1 lb. to a quark make an excellent cooling drink for fevers, dc. It is not needful to keep different kinds of dried berries remarks though more para is resugcted in berries separate, though more care is requested in packing them, as the slight wrapperstusually put around them are apt to burst, and they contents be wasted in handling. Paper is tendered by the mois-ture of the fruit, which should be put in bags, of
