Woopen Guns .- In the battles before Mobile wooden mortare were use il with good resulta. According to: rebel istatements they were most destructive. General McArthur had a balf dozen mortars made of the wood of the gum tree, and they were used during the whole attack. One shell from a wooden gun is known to have killed and 'wounded' eleven Confederate soldiers, and the rebels assert they were the most destructive guns used. Two of these wooden mortars have been brought to the city by Col. Thomas and Capt. McLean, and will be open to inspection, at the St. Charles ". Hotel to-morrow. It is this design of these officers to send these ""new fangled" guns to the Chicago Sanitary Commission Fair, to see how much they will bring in aid of the Boldiers .-One hundred shells were fired from one of these mortars. This is not the first time that wooden guns have been used. The first use of gunpowder as a means of warfare was to project bullets from wooden guns hooped with iron or bound with raw hide. Even so late as the times of Frederick the Great, these apparently insecure pieces were employed with excellent effect. Wooden mortars, however, are a new thing under the sun. so far as our historical knowledge extends.-St. Louis paper.
