Education of Soldiers' Orphans.

Some months ago we published, an act of the Legislature, approved in 1864, relative to the Education and maintenance of Soldiers' Orphans. The Pein. Ilvania Railroad Company douated \$50,005 to Governor Curtin in trust for this object; and the Gover. nor appointed Hon. Thos. H. Burroughs, of Janenster, Superintendent for the disbursement of this fund, and he appoints a Superintending Committee in each county, approved by the Governor.

We make a digest of the plan for the disbi tement of this fund : Children of etther sex under 25 years, dependent on public or private charity, or apon'the labor of a mother or other destitute person, whose fathers died of wounds received, or of disease contracted in the line of duty in the army or mavy of. the United States-being actual residents of Pennsylvania when they entered the service-are entitled to the benefits of the act.

The application must be made by the mother, if · living; if dead, then by guardian or next friend, in form and manner prescribed by the State Superintendent, and which may be had as hereinafter stated.
