

FORCING RHUBARB .- Those who have an abundance of rhubarb roots may have the leaf stalks during the winter with but little trouble. Take up some strong roots and place them in a barrel with a little HEAVY AND earth. Cover the barrel and set it in a warm place, and the leaves will soon push. Grown in this way rhubarb is crisp, ten-der and well blanched. Roots that have been thus treated are not worth planting out again.

Four turkeys were cooped up and led with meal, boiled potatoes and oats; four others of the same brood were treated in the same manner in another pen, but with a pint daily of pulverized charcoal added to the food and an abundant supply of the coal. All eight were killed in the same day, and those fed with charcoal were found to weigh a pound and a half more than the others and to be of much better quality.
