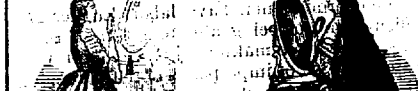

The Rebels Increasing Their Forces

300 Rebel Cavalry Lay Down Arms and Refuse to Fight.

THEY SURRENDER TO THE UNION TROOPS.
