The Gunboat Cincinnati Sunk by Rebels. Prisoners Paroled on Account of the Scarcity of Food. Chicago, Ill., May 2.

ANOTHER FEDERAL RAID. DEFEAT OF REBELS AT FLORENCE, ALA.

DESTRUCTION OF FOUNDRIES AND MILLS. Accounts have been received that Colonel Alabama defeated the General Roddy at Florence, Alabama, on the 27th, capturing one hundred men, eight officers and four hundred mules; also, three hundred negroes—and was marching northward.

GENERAL BURNSIDE EXCLUDED FROM GENERAL BURNHAM'S DEPARTMENT. General Orders No. 84 from General Burnside prohibits the circulation of the New York World in this department, and suppresses the Chicago Times.

ARRIVAL OF SPECIES FROM NEW ORLEANS. The steamer Crook brought \$80,000 of specie from New Orleans and a detachment of Choctaws, captured by Capt. Reed's rifles, with their Chief, Sweetstakes.

Several negroes in the employ of the Government in the Western Department have been cruelly murdered by your authorities and others sold into slavery.
