# More About the Great Conspiracy

I am a Douglas Democrat, and I am hastening home to see what can be done to prevent my State from casting its electoral vote for Brockuri ge. h ve been in Washington sicce the first of of July, and I tell you no e, eir, there is at this moment on foot at Washington the most damnable conspiracy to break up this Government that was ever known in any civilized

country.
