A Cunboat Lifted Ten Feet out of Water

FORTRES MORROR, Aug. 10.

The expedition that left bere on the 4th inst., under direction of M-jor General Foster, was accompanied by the turret hon clar Singamon and the gunboats Commodore Barney and Co-They proceeded up the James river and when above City Point an I within about seven miles of Fort Darling, at a point called Dutch Gap, a torpedo was exploded under the bows of the

ommodore Barney, by a lock string connecting with the shore. The explosion is described as most terrific,

of balls, and not a man was injured except the paymaster, slightly.
