The reader can see from this order what are the different degrees of tyranny prevailing in the South and the North. We doubt whether any man, who feels so aggrieved at the exactions of our Government here, would be willing to exchange places with the resident of a Southern State; any poor man, we mean, for if he was the owner of twenty slaves he would escape the conscription more easily than the owner of \$300 among us, for the latter has to give his money to escape, but the former escapes because of the possession of his slaves. Our law takes property, therefore, in lieu of service. Theirs exempts the slave owner because he has property, and secures him the possession of his property
