WASHINGTON PROCLAMATION BY THE PRESIDENT

CAIL FOR 300,000 MORE TROOPS MOVEMENTS OF LEE'S ARMY.

WASHINGTON, Cct. 17, 1863. BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA: A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, the term of service of a part of the volunteer forces of the United States will expire during the coming year; and whereas, in addition to the men raised by the present draft, it is deemed expedient to call out three hundred thousand volunteers to serve for three years or the war, not however exceed ug three years. Now therefore, I, Abraham Lincoln, President of the United States, and commander-in-chief of the Army and Navy thereof, and of the mi-

litia of the several States when called into active service, do issue this my proclamation calling upon the dovernors of the different States to raise and have enlisted into the United States service for the various companies and regiments in the field from their respective States, their quotas of three hundred thousand men:

"I further proclaim, that all volunteers thus

called out and duly enlisted, shall receive advance pay, premiums and bounty as heretofore communicated to the Governors of States by the Wat Department through the Provost Marshal the world to produce an equal; they are, in the General's office by special letters most obstinate cases,

under this call, as well as all others not hereto-foregredited, shall be duly credited on and de-ducted from the quotas established for the next

I further proclaim that if any State shall fail I further proclaim that if any State shall fall to raise the quota assigned to it by the War Department under this call, then the said quota shall be made on said State or on the districts of said State for their due proportion of said quota, and the said dafa shall commence on the last day of January, 1884.

And I further proclaim, that nothing in this proclamation shall interfere with existing orders, or those which may be issued for the present draft in the States where it is now in progress or where it has not yet.
