PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, the Honorable JOHN J. PLEASANT, President of the Court of Common Pleas in the Twelfth Judicial District, consisting of the counties of Lebanon and Dauphin, and the Hon. SAMUEL L. LANE and Hon. MOSES B. YOUNG, Associate Judges in said county, having issued their process, bearing date the 1st day of Dec., 1863, to me directed, for holding a Court of Oyer and Terminer and General Jail Delivery and Quarter Sessions of the Peace at Harrisburg, for the county of Dauphin, and to commence on the 20th day of January next, being the 18th day of January, 1864, and to continue two weeks.

Notice is hereby given to the Coronator, Justices of the Peace, Aldermen, and Constables of said county of Dauphin, that they be then and there in their proper persons, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of said day, with their records, inquisitions, examinations, and their own necessary records, to do those things which to their office appertain to be done, and those who are bound in recognizances to prosecute against the prisoners that are or shall be in the Jail of Dauphin county, be then and there to present against them as shall be just.

Given under my hand, at Harrisburg, the 1st day of December, in the year of our Lord 1863, and in the eighty-eighth year of the Independence of the United States.
