amendment passed. On motion of Mr. Wilson, the bill equalizing the pay of soldiers was called up, pending the amendment of Mr. Collamer. A debate ensued on the amendment of Mr. Cellamer. The bill to equalize the pay of soldiers in Mr. Wilthe U. S. Army, was called up by Mr. Wilson. The pending amendment being of that Mr. Collamer to include all persons enlisted under the call of October, 1863, in the provisions for bounties, except in insurrectionary districts. After debate, Mr. Sumner moved to amend After debate, Mr. Summer moved to amend this amendment, providing that all persons whose papers show that they were enlisted under the act of 1861, shall receive the pay and beunty promised in that statute. The amendment of Mr. Summer was adopted—20 against 18. Yeas-Messrs. Clarke, Collamer, Conness, Dixon, Doolittle, Fessenden, Foote, Foster, Hale, Harding, Howard, Lane, (Kansas,) Mor-gan, Morrill, Pomeroy, Sprague, Sumner, Ten Eyck, Van Winkle and Wilson. Nays-Messrs. Buckalew, Carlisle, Davis, 37c. Grimes, Harlan, Harris, Henderson, Hen-dricks, Howe, Johnson, Lane (Ind.,) Nesmith, Powell, Ramsey, Saulsbury, Wilkinson, Willey and Wright. Mr. Wilson offered an amendment which extends pay and bounty to free persons.— The amendment was discussed at length by Mr. Howard in opposition and Mr. Wilson in support. Without disposing of the matter, it was, on motion, postponed until to-morrow. The Chair was authorized to appoint a com-mittee of conference on the disagreeing votes on the bill reviving the grade of Lieutenant General. On motion of Mr. Wilson, the Committee on Military Affairs were instructed to inquire into the expediency of extending the bounties to April next. The Senate went into executive session, and soon afterwards adjourned. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. Mr. Spalding (N. Y.) introduced a bill granting pensions to soldiers of the war of 1812. Referred to the Committee on Pensions, Mr. Washburne (Ill.) moved to take up House bill to revive the grade of Lieutenant General as returned from the Senate, with an amendment, striking out the recommenda-tion that General Grant be appointed Lieu-tenant General. His object was to disagree in order that a committee of conference might be asked for. Mr. Fink objected, when the House re sumed the consideration of the bill to establish a bureau for freedmen's affairs. Mr. Davis (Md.) defended the validity of the late Maryland elections. He spoke of the progress of emancipation in that State, say-ing they were under small obligations to President Lincoln for what had been done there. He advocated an amendment to the Constitution resolutely declaring as a coudition on the re-admission of the secended States dec12-dtf
