The working expenses of the road have been 73 1-10 per cent. of the receipts. This, however, includes the purchase of four new

locomotives, at a cost of \$46,865, which does not properly belong to working expenses, benot properly belong to working expenses, be-sides new passenger, baggage, express and freight cars, costing \$158,690 69, and the par-tial renewal of bridges destroyed, \$55,000; which would reduce the working expenses to 61 81-100 per cent of the earnings, showing an increase over the expenses of the pre-vious year of 10 1-10 per cent. This increase is attributable to the advance in the price of labor and materials of every description, and might have been met by a corresponding inmight have been met by a corresponding increase of rates on transportation, had the Board not deemed it due to the interests of

the city of Baltimore, to keep the rates so as to attract trade to Baltimore, which, under a different policy, might have been sent to other cities.

The laying of the second track as far north as Parkton, twenty-nine miles from Baltimore, has been ordered, and it is expected that it will be completed during the present year to that point, it having become a necessity to that point, it naving occurs a necessary to the safe and economical management of the trains. The laying of the second track is al-ready finished to the Relay, and the track graded to Cockeysville, and it is hoped that it will be in running order to that point by the first of June, when it is intended to put on an additional train to accommodate the local travel, which is rapidly increasing, and is of such a character that the utmost promptness is requisite, and cannot be satisfactorily done by the through trains, which are now over oaded, and are frequently detained by the numerous connections made by other roads between Buffalo and Baltimore. The revenue from the local passenger business in Decem-ber last showed an increase of 20 per cent. over the revenue of the corresponding month of the previous year. It is intended to afford

every possible facility for the local travel. The Board regret that they are unable to report any progress in the important work of the Canton extension, owing to the opposition of the Mayor of Baltimore. In pursuance of a resolution unanimously adopted at the last meeting of the stockholders, the Board have eased for 999 years the Shamokin Valley and Pottsville Railroad, and the Elmira and Wil-liamsport Railroad, upon terms which at the time were considered favorable, with a view of securing a perfect line with a policy in har-mony with the interests of the company, be-tween Baltimore and lakes Eric and Onterio. The net revenue of the Samokin Valley and Pottsville Railroad from Feb. 1st, 1863, (the date at which the Board took possession,) to December 31st, 1863, sums up \$26,256 03, being over 3 per cent. on the entire amount of the capital stock of the road. The opera-tion of the Elmine and Williamsport road, since the lease of it by the Board, May 1st, 1863, up to December 31st, 1863, shows a net revenue of \$2,368 63. These results are re-garded as very satisfactory. In order to fully carry out the wishes of the Pottsville Railroad from Feb. 1st. 1863, (the

In order to fully carry out the wishes of the stockholders as expressed in the resolution referred to; the Board effected an arrangement with the Erie Railway Company of the State of New York, for the operation of the Baltimore and Philadelphia trade over the Buffalo, New York and Erie Railroad (which has been leased by the Erie Railroad Com-

pany), from Buffalo, and Rochester. The Board, however, are unable to give any ing out of this contract, owing to the non-re-ceipt of full reports from the Erie Railway Company, who have control of the accounts. The operation of the road under the control of the Board, or in which they have an interest by contract, has been limited by the ab-sence of the much needed double track.

In relation to the numerous delays which have occurred during the past year, the Board say the affairs of all departments, upon full investigation, appear to have performed their duties in a creditable manner, and the delays have been occasioned by endeavois to accom-modate the very heavy business and the pub-lic too, and thus the road has been taxed be-

yond its capacity. ' This state of affairs, it is thought, must continue to some extent until the close of the war. The resolution passed at the last meet-
