ROBBERY ON THE CARS.—On Friday afternoon a robbery occurred on the Cumberland Valley train, when it arrived in this city. Captain Charles Churchill, a disbursing officer in the employ of Uncle Sam, was a passenger on the train. When he left the cars at the depot, he left in his seat a satchel containing several hundred dollars in gold and paper. Returning shortly afterwards for his property, he found that it had been taken by another passenger, (who had been seated next the Captain,) who claimed it, and obtained it from Albert Cadow, a newsboy belonging to the train. Churchill employed Officer Nevin, of the police force, to look after the missing property. The officer and young Cadow visited a number of the public houses, and finally found the satchel at the Franklin House, near the jail. Cadow recognized it as the one he had given out at the car. The man, who left it at the above named hotel was arrested, and gave his name as Levi Mitchell, of Carlisle. He had a hearing before Alderman Kline, who committed him for trial. None of the money had yet been distributed. Officer Nevin and young Cadow were presented with fifty dollars for their trouble.

Mitchell was searched at the Alderman's office, and about eight hundred dollars were found upon his person. It is probable that he had been "operating" among the soldiers.

WATER COMMITTEE.

THE NORTHERN CENTRAL RAILWAY COMPANY.—Annual Meeting of the Stockholders.—The general meeting of the stockholders of the Northern Central Railway Company was held at Calvert Station, Thursday, at noon. On motion of Mr. B. F. Newcomer, Colonel John S. Gittings was called to the chair, and Robert S. Hollins, Esq., appointed secretary. After reading the annual report from the President and Superintendent, it was referred to a committee of five stockholders, to report on the subject matter in the report to an adjourned meeting of the stockholders, to be held on the 15th day of April next, in Baltimore.

The meeting proceeded to the selection of directors, when 36,865 shares were voted out of the whole number—45,300—into which the stock is divided. The following gentlemen were elected: John A. Wright, A. E. Kapp, Edward C. Biddle, Benjamin F. Newcomer, Thos. H. Scott, Jacob P. Jones, Wm. Colder, George Small, John M. Kennedy, Henry Welsh, Joseph D. Potts and Wistar Morris. The meeting adjourned until Friday, April 15th.

The newly elected Board of Directors subsequently organized and re-elected John D. Cameron, Esq., President, and Mr. C. G. Miller, of Buffalo, Vice President, and Robert S. Hollins, Esq., Secretary and Treasurer.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS.  
The following is a synopsis of the report of the Board of Directors, submitted by the President, showing the operations during the past year:

The total receipts for the year ending December 31, 1863, as reported by the Treasurer, were \$2,442,864.19; the expenditures \$1,688,867.41, yielding a net revenue of \$753,996.78. To show the actual earnings of the road there should be added to the gross earnings \$185,364.11, due from the United States Government for business done the past year, but not yet collected, which would make the net balance of \$945,360.89, of which has been applied to the payment of interest on funded debt \$295,500; instalments for the year on sinking fund \$35,000; excess of surplus on hand \$159,860.89.

The working expenses of the road have been 73 1-10 per cent. of the receipts. This, however, includes the purchase of four new locomotives, at a cost of \$46,866, which does not properly belong to working expenses, besides new passenger, baggage, express and freight cars, costing \$158,890.69, and the partial renewal of bridges destroyed, \$55,000; which would reduce the working expenses to 61 81-100 per cent. of the earnings, showing an increase over the expenses of the previous year of 10 1-10 per cent. This increase is attributable to the advance in the price of labor and materials of every description, and might have been met by a corresponding increase of rates on transportation, had the Board not deemed it due to the interests of the city of Baltimore, to keep the rates so as to attract trade to Baltimore, which, under a different policy, might have been sent to other cities.

The laying of the second track as far north as Parkton, twenty-nine miles from Baltimore, has been ordered, and it is expected that it will be completed during the present year, at that point, it having become a necessity to the safe and economical management of the trains.
