WASHINGTON, Feb. 27. Mr. Harding (Ky.) argued against the President's plan of reconstruction, character-izing the scheme as mapped out by the master builder with a pencil dipped in blood. He (Mr. Harding) assumed that the secession orfinances were void, and in the termination of

the rebellion the revolting States have a right to return, with all their privileges under the Constitution. Mr. Denning (Conn.) maintained that though the President's plan is not beyond cavil, it as as complete and comprehensive as the intricacies of the subject will permit, and possesses the rare merit of the justice of the Government to the insurgent States and to the slave.
