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Tea, Coffee and Cocoa for the Sick.

Too much is said against tea by wise people, and too much of tea is given to the sick by foolish people. When you see the natural and almost universal craving in Figlish sick for their "tea," you cannot but feel that nature knows what she is about. But a little tea or coffee restores them quite as much as a great deal, and a great deal of tea, and aspecially of coffee, impairs the little power of digestion they have. Yet the nurse, because she sees how one or two cups of tea or coffee re-stores her patient, thinks that three or four will do twice as much. This is not the case at all, it is, however, certain, there is nothing yet discovered which is a subsitute to the English patient for his cup of tea; he can take it when he can take nothing else, and he often can't take anything else if he has it not. I should be very glad if one of the abusers of tea would point out what to give an English patient after a sleepless night instead of tea. If you give it at fiveor six o'clock in the morning, he may even sometimes fall asleep after it, and get, per-haps, his only two or three hours' sleep during the twenty-four. At the same time, you never should give tea or coffee to the sick, as a rule, after five o'clock in the afternoon. Sleeplessness in the early part of the night is from excitement, generally, and is increased by tea or coffee; sleeplessness, which continues to the early morning, is from exaustion often, and is relieved by tea. The only English patients I have ever known refuse tea have been typhus cases, and the first sign of their getting better was their craving again for tea. In general the dry and dirty tongue always prefers tea to coffee, and will quite decline milk, unless with tea. Coffee is a better restorative than tea; but a greater impairer of the digestion. Let the patient's taste decide. You will say that in cases of great thirst, the patient's craving decides that it will drink a great deal of tea, and that you cannot help it. But in these cases be sure that the patient requires diluents for quite other purposes than quenching the thirst; he wants a good deal of some drink, not only of tea, and the dector will order that he is to have barley water and milk, as the case may be. Lehman, quoted by Dr. Christison, says that among the well and active, "the infusion of an ounce of coffee daily will diminish the waste!' going on in the body 'by one-fourth;" and Dr. Christi-sch adds that tea has the same property.— New, this is the actual experiment. Lchman weighs the man and finds the fact from weight. It is not deduced from any analysis" of food. All experience among ithe sick shows the same thing, Oocoa is often recomended to the sick in lieu of tea or coffee. But independent of the fact that English sick very generally dislike cocoa, it has quite a different effect from tea or coffee.
