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#### The United States Senate. Daniel Webster's famous expression of thank-

fulness to God for the existence of the United States Senate; has not often been repeated during the last ten years. Perhaps it may be because republics are ungrateful; but possibly it may be because in the composition of the Sen-ate there is less to be thankful for than former ly. Certainly the great majority of its memebers for some time have been distinguished for having the organ of mediocrity "excessively large." as phrenologists would say. The party, besides, having control of that division of the national legislature. ty, besides, having control of that division of the national legislature, would seem to have looked upon their functions as little other than to register decrees which had eminated from the White House. If there was ever the slight-est refractory disposition shown by them, the ominous words "Black Republicans" would as infallibly drive them back to the ranks as the

infallibly drive them back to the ranks as the name of the lion-hearted Richard used for ages to hush Moslem babes, when they had become too fractious to be otherwise put asleep.

One remarkable exception to this rule, however, occurs to our memory. The President sent down a request, a la Nopoleon, for some additional regiments of troops to operate on the South-western frontier. The measure was in a fair way of passing until Mr. Seward defeated it. This was brought about, not by opposing, but by befriending the bill. The New York Senator announced that, after carefully inspecting the portents and omens, the field was won, ing the portents and omens, the field was won, and that these troops would yet become the bulwark of freedom, as others had been employed to trample it down in Kansas. Enough I The Senatorial statesmen found they had made a mistake; and that much as they wished to support the President, they hated Mr. Seward more. So the bill was defeated by a large ma-

jority.

The circumstance affords a key to the policy which appears to have prevailed in the Senate for some time; and has since descended to the ordinary level of party controversy. The pole-star has not been adhesion to fixed princilples so much as opposition to certain persons. Repulsion, not attraction, has been the impelling force. Substitute for the Senate the whole country, and for Mr. Seward Abraham Lincoln, and we again find the same element at work. Of course, those who put themselves under its direction are responsible for the consequences. All the New England states, with New York, Michigan, Wisconsin and Iowa, are now represented in the Senate by Republicans and D. mocrats. The Pacific states and Indiana are rep-

crats. The Pacific states and Indiana are represented by Democrats only. Of the whole sixty-six members, thirty-six are administration, Democrats, two are Douglasites, and twenty-seven are Republicans. Such will be the relative strength of parties until after the 4th of March next.

Some important changes will then occur. In the South Mr. Crittenden will give place to Mr. Breckinnidge, who very prudently secured that desirable retreat in advance, in case of his failure to reach the Presidency. The terms of Messrs. Fitzpatrick of Alabams, Johnson of Arkansas, Hammond of South Carolina, Yulee of Florida, Iverson of Georgia, Slidell of Louistiania, Green of Missouri, and Clingman of North carbinda, Green of Missouri, and Clipgman of North Carolina (all Democrats), expire in 1861, and they or others of the same party will probably be elected. Messrs. Gwin of California, Fitch of Indiana, Lane of Oregon, Bigler of Pennsylvania, we expect to see succeeded by Republicans or Anti-Lecompton Democrats. Mr Pugh cans or Anti-Lecompton Democrats; Mr. Pugh of Ohio, has already given place to Mr. Chase; and the recent elections have left no doubt respecting Pennsylvania and Indiana. California may possibly send a Republican to Washington in place of Dr. Gwin; and so far as Oregon is concerned the only obstacle to the election of at least one Republican seems to lie in the Senate of that State, the administration minority of which has grown desperate in its determination to elect Mr. Lane or defeat every other can-

didate. The terms of Messrs. Trumbull of Illinois, Foster of Connelicut, Hallan of Iowa, Clark of New Hampshire, Seward of New York, Collames of Vermont, and Durkee of Wisconsin (all Republicans), expire also next year. If the present members are not re-elected their places doubtless will be taken by Republicans. In case of Mr. Hamlin's election to the Vice Presidency, his seat will also become vacant, and of course be filled by a member of the same

The terms of Messers. Thompson of New Jersey, Bright of Indiana, and Rice of Minnesota, do not expire until 1863; otherwise they would have to leave the Senate. Mr. Douglass would have to leave the Senate. Mr. Dougless holds on to 1865; but he cannot be regarded any longer as in fellowship with the great body of Senators professing Democracy. Exercising his own doctrine of popular sovereignty in that chamber, and freed from all aspirations after a higher sphere, he may be expected to become and to make amends in some degree for the storms of strife which he has generated during the past. We shall be happy to witness this Octavius transformed into another Augustus. which his failure to be chosen President is more likely to accomplish than would be an opposite

After the 4th of March next, we may reasonably estimate the political complexion of the Senate to be as follows:

Thirteen Republican States—Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio Michigan Wisconsin Laws and Kansachusetts. Ohio, Michigan, Wisconsin, Iowa and Kansas, if admitted, as we trust she will be

Six Divided States.—New Jersey, Indiana, Illinois, Minnesota, Maryland, Oregon, giving five Republicans, four Democrats, two Opposition Democrats, and one American (Mr. Ken-Fifteen Democratic States, including California, which may choose a Republican or Opposition Democratio Senator; also, including Louisiana, where the Douglas men entertain hopes of electing Mr. Soule. We consider the chance of such results fully equal to the further iniquitous

rejection of Kansas.

The Senate would then stand after 1861— Republicans, 31; Regular Democrats, 34; Opposition Democrats, 2; American, 1. Total 68. The party now in power will altersfore; have a working majority until 1868 sepand that everything depends on the action of the Republican members. They may go so strength ening themselves until their ranks receive large accessions from the slave States, or they may fritter away their present strength and destroy their prospects, so as to be on the brink of ruin by that time.—N. Y. Com. Advertiser.

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
