Mormonism is largely favored with the "republicative quality." Last April about fifty missionaries were sent to Europe; on Sunday afternoon thirty more were appointed to reinforce. Two apostles—Lyman and Rich—went to England in charge of the fifty; three apostles, Pratt, Snow and Cannon, leave in about ten days with the thirty new appointees. Pratt and Snow wish to devote their labors to the States, and Cannon goes to Liverpool as editor and business agent. From this time until the next war, missionaries will go out in swarms every April and September—the first "travelling month" in spring, and the last month in fall for departure, to avoid the snows in the mountains. How ONE OF THEM VIEWED IT.—The Memphis (Tenn.) Appeal, says:—"Should the secession of one or two Southern States occur; if not alone by the Federal Government, for six months, each State will 'become' again back wards into the Union. Ane Lincoln need not do the navy or the army; we could not fight our brethren of the South; however inestimable the quarrel in which they may involve themselves. But there is no need for an army or navy, being seceded States to their senses; we will be enriched while they will be impoverished by such a movement, till necessity would involve reason, and the fiery politicians whom ambition has maddened would be defeated and the Union would soon again be perfected on a more durable basis, if possible, than that on which it now rests."
