Great Speech of the New Senator from Oregon.

Colonel E. D. BAKER, the new Senator from Oregon, made a great speech in San Francisco, which is reported in the late California papers as follows:

It is your fault (addressing the Breciknridge men), and not ours, if you will not allow us to go South to get votes. Breckinridge will get no votes in New York except by pretending not to run. It is hard to say that any party is sectional because there are some States in which they would not get many votes. We deny, as we have and will deny, that we have any desire to interfere with slavery, where it now exists by law; we say that we will not interfere with slavery, in State or Territory, when it has been put there by the will of the people. We have never proposed to interfere with the existence of slavery by law in any slave State. We, as a party, and individually, have more interest in preserving the Union than you have, either ju ging by our numbers or our property. We never proposed to dissolve the Union. No member of the Republican party ever proposed

to dissolve the Union. Many of us are old Whigs, but we never proposed, when beaten, to dissolve the BICH PLAIN AND FIGURED Union; nor did the Republican party, when Buchanan was elected. Did any one ever hear is wish for or predict it? I will not say that every Breckinridge man is a Disunionist; but I will say that every Disunionist is a Breckinridge man.

This idea Colonel Baker illustrated by an amusing anecdote, as to the mispronunciation of a name by an Irishman, and applied it to the Breckinridge party.

He adverted to the speeches of Lane and other speakers, even here in California, to lissolve the Union. He described what the term Union meant. No Republican ever meant that it should be dissolved — It was very easy to talk of disunion when out of office. Republicans do not mean to dissolve the Union, nor to let any one else do it. The speaker then alluded to the causes why the Breckinridge people want to dissolve the Union. First, they would dissolve the Union. First, they would dissolve the Union if Lincoln is elected.—
They would have a chance to try it.—
[Laughter] But Mr. Lincoln had no power without the Senate and 4 jouse, and if we have the people, the President, the House, and the Senate it would are is hard thurst and the Senate it would to hard thing to dissolve the Union. What has been said or done to justify a dissolution of the Union made any declaration justifying any such procedure. He then proposed in rapid succession, a veries of questions by the Democratic party, which he answered to show that no possible reason could be urged by the South in favor of dissolution. In dedicating territory to free labor, we had done no more than what our fathers did before us.

Col. Baker avowed himself, a Popular Sovereighty Republican. He was in favor of allowing the people of the Territories to govern themselves. He had so announced himself last year, and was so now. He believed in the ability of the people to govern themselves. He know that the people of this Union will not tolerate a avery upon tree soil. He would seize this weapon from the Donglas men. it was a great we spon in the hands of the Republic as. and was their spear. He illustrated the question of carrying negros into the Territories, and showed that the right did not and could not exist. He met the assertion that property can be taken where you like, with the fact that there was a species of local or sectional property which was dan-gerous to be carried wherever the owner ileased. The meaning of the Dread Scott decision

was then considered and the interpretation of it by the Democracy. He showed how the distribution of slavery had injured the count y and retarded its progress. He was in lavor of meeting the issue. He was in lavor of popular sovereignty, and pro ceeded to show how to meet it. He was in layor of sustaining the Supreme Court by the fullest acquiescence; but to put in better men when those old judges passed away. The people would endorse the decision of the Supreme Court by putting in better men. The deliberate expression of the people must and will prevail. The decision of the Supreme Court do not remain forever. The blot and stain of slavery cannot exist and go to all parts of the Union. as that Dread Scott decision announces .-It would be treason to Lumanity and popular justice. He invited the Douglas men to come and

join the Republicans, as the proper place for them to work and vote in. He alfuded to the different nationalities, and particularly to the way in which the Irish were voting. He appealed to them particularly to assert the dignity of labor; he would not have the odor of slavery about or near them. He would appeal to the German. Since we had backed Cass & Co., out of their Le Clerc doc rine, they could return to their homes to visit. He then imagin da conversation between a returned young German and his father in Germany, and made the young man define the difference between equal rights to all men. (the Republican doctrine) and the Democratic doctrine of equal rights to all sections. The picture thus urawn was a vivid and telling. one. The young German was urged to be able to give a right and correct account of himself when he returned. The greatest interest was shown in this portion of the speech, and the applause was frequent. The speaker had often stopped to con

sider who the Republican party was. He had often asked binself who he was working with. He enumerated all the great and glorious component parts of the Reputlican parly, and the opposites of the De-mocracy. The ideas of personal liberty are now obtaining all over the world They are spreading and everywhere in-creasing. The only exception is here,
