If the Capital Stock has all been subscribed, the Bank may go into operation before the subscription shall have been paid up in full, provided the twenty per centum of specie shall be in possession of the Rank, and bonufide its property. Whenever a Bank is thus organized, it is entitled to receive from the Auditor General any amount of circulating notes of the prescribed denominations, for which

it shall assign to, and deposit with him eviden-ces of the Public debt of Pennsylvania or of the United States, not exceeding the market price of the stocks deposited with five per cent off.— After the Bank has gone into operation and is sued its circulating notes; it is required to have

at all times on hand, in gold and silver coin, or its equivalent, in its vault, an amount equal to twenty per centum of all its circulating notes of every description whatever. As a bank with a subscribed capital of \$50,000 may go into operation as soon as \$10,000 have been paid in specie or its equivalent, and may on depositing in the office evidences of the public debt of thi State or the United States, amounting, at fiv per cent less than the market price, to \$5,000 it would thus be required to commence business with a supply of specie amounting to ten times as much as it would be required to retain for the purpose of redeeming its notes in circula tion. There seems to be no good reason why a Bank should at any time be required to hold
