DIRECTIONS.

BREAKPAST AND TRA ROLLS.—Two or three teaspoonsful of Leaven, (according to the quality of the flour,) to one quart of flour; mix theroughly by passing two or three times through a sieve; rub in a piece of butter half the size of an egg, and make the paste with cold milk or water, (milk is preferable.) barely stiff enough to permit rolling out.
