THE SOUTH ARMING. CHARLESTON, April 16. The Federal fleet stopped three vessels which were coming into this harbor last evening, one of the vessels displayed the Spanish flag, one the British and the other the American ensign. Little Delaware True to the Union. WILMINGTON, Del., April 16. One of the largest meetings ever convened in Delaware is now in progress at the city Hall, the Mayor presiding. Amunition of War at Washington. WASHINGTON, April 16. Several additional companies of volunteers were mustered into service to-day. The government has directed that no more copies of the Coast Survey shall be sent to the seceded States.

Reception of President Lincoln's Message. MOBILE, Ala., April 16. President Lincoln's proclamation was read in the Cabinet meeting yesterday and greeted with shouts of laughter. The Secretary of War has authorized the statement that 32,000 additional troops will be called out to-day to meet the Federal army.

LATER NEWS FROM EUROPE. The North Briton at Portland. Bank Rates Reduced to Six Per Cent. CONSOLS 91 3/4 @ 91 1/2. PORTLAND, April 16. The steamer North Briton has arrived with Liverpool dates to Friday, the 6th inst. The Bank rates of discount have been reduced 6 per cent.

London Money Market, April 5.—On the 3d the funds declined 1/2, but closed steady; on the 4th the market opened firm, and considerable quantities of gold arriving, the Bank reduced the rate of discount to 6 per cent. \$25,000 in gold arrived at the Bank to-day.

Paris Bourse was depressed, and rents were lower. Garibaldi was received with great enthusiasm at Turin. The Opinions, of Turin, advocates the withdrawal of the French troops from Rome, as the National Italian army will soon perform their duties.

Madrid, April 2.—Morocco is tranquil. The military force in the Southern Provinces are to be increased. It is reported that Garibaldi and the Hungarians have a perfect understanding.

Virginia Convention—Harbor Blockaded. RICHMOND, April 16. The State Convention is being in secret session and the reports are excluded. A telegraphic dispatch from Governor Pickens to Mr. Wise, reports that eleven war vessels are now off the harbor, and have stopped vessels on the regular trade with that city.

New York Markets. NEW YORK, April 16. Cotton firmer, sales 1,300 bales at 12 3/4. Flour heavy, and declined 6c. Sales 5,600 bbls.

Orders Countermanded. WASHINGTON, April 16. It is said that the orders for the Rhode Island and Massachusetts regiments under the recent levy to be immediately proceeded to Washington have been countermanded, for the reason that arrangements have not been made for their accommodation.
