Virginia Backing Down

New Jersey Volunteers.

WASHINGTON, May 4. From private sources, believed to be entirely reliable, it is ascertained that Virginia, of herself, does not meditate an advance on Washington, that subject being for the consideration of the Confederate States. Their throwing of troops into Virginia is said to be in anticipation of a declaration of war by the Southern Congress, as well as an apprehension that the gathering of so large a military force here is designed, ultimately, to invade the South.

The Post Office Department, after carrying into effect its past orders as to offices, will chiefly confine its action to supplying vacancies by death and resignations, and to removals for cause. This is deemed a proper tribute to the patriotism and loyalty of the people of the loyal States, in view of the new and controling issues of Government.

The War Department especially keeps its officers employed night and day. An immense amount of business is transacted. The telegraphic wire leading directly to the Chief Clerk's room is both convenient and time sav ing, and is constantly employed in the transmission and receipt of messages.

The Administration is not a little amused at the representations made in the papers of New York and elsewhere, that it is sluggish and not safely at Quebec. One of the steerage passenufficiently active in view of the present crisis. gers is still missing. They point to the fact that Fort Pickens and all the forts in the Gulf, and Fortress Monroe and Fort M'Henry, are fully reinforced and supplied, a blockade actually organized, the capital of the country securely guarded, and a formidable army ready for any emergency. And, besides these things, the strengening of the Navy with the least possible delay.

The U.S. steamer Pawnee left this port this norning for a cruise in the Potomac and to be on the look out.

The Alexandrians are expecting that the Government will take possession of the Post Office and Custom House there. The wharves are deserted, owing to the blockade of the Chesapeake.

The United States Minister to Portugal, Mr. Harvey, leaves for his post to night. There is no truth in the statement that Hon.

C. J. Faulkner, our Minister to France, presented the Confederate Commissioners at the Imperial Court. His official connections with the French mission ceased before the Confederate Commissioners left this country.

An application has been made by the diplomatic corps at the Department of State, and the following points relative to the southern blockade have been ascertained: First—Vessels lying in blockaded ports when

the blockade took effect, will be allowed a real sonable time to denart Second-Vessels bringing emigrants, though

they had no notice of the announcement of the blockade, will not be allowed to enter blockaded ports. As emigrants and that class of persons from abroad come to the United States chlefly to settle in the Northern and Northrectionary condition of the Gulf States.

The quiet of the past week continues here,

but every day helps to atrengthen the defences

of Washington and the discipline of the troops. The railroad facilities between here and Annapolis are much improved since additional cars have been brought from Philadelphia. Mr. Thos. A. Scott, Vice President of the Pennsylvania Builroad Company, who has charge of the road, is "the right man in the right place."

The doings of the Maryland Legislature are egarded with distrust and uneasiness. But little faith is put in the protestations of the Monday. Sorder States. A little more show of strength on the part of the Government is needed to keep Maryland right.

The Providence Marine Artillery arrived here esterday evening, and are much admired. Some of the Pennsylvania troops have been ent down to Fort Washington.

The accounts from down the river and along both sides of Chesapeake Bay, are satisfactory. The rebels do not show themselves, and no batteries bavesbeen erected,

Charles Tibbetts, a member of the Rhode Island Regiment, was married last night to one of "the daughters of the regiment," Miss Sarah Beasley. The soldiers celebrated the event with great pomp and festivity.

THE MAINE REGIMENT TO LEAVE NEW YORK TO NIGHT.
