NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS. SPECIFICATIONS adopted by the County Commissioners of the counties of Dauphin and Perry, for the building and construction of a Public Road, as recited in the Act of Assembly, in the following words to-wit:

SECTION 1. That the Commissioners of the several counties of Dauphin and Perry are hereby authorized and empowered, immediately after the passing of this Act, to lay out and construct a good and substantial road, commencing at a point near where the Turnpike Bridge crosses the Susquehanna Canal, in Ward Township, Perry county, and running easterly to the Turnpike Bridge, such distance as will enable them to strike the Turnpike in Read Township, Dauphin county, near Duncan's Barn, but not to interfere with said Turnpike so as to obstruct navigation or otherwise.

SECTION 2. That the several counties through which this Road passes will be entitled to pay for the making of this Road as much of the same as passes through its own territory.

Approved, April 18th, 1860. Therefore, in pursuance of the above recited Act, the Commissioners of said counties, as aforesaid, have adopted the following Specifications, to-wit:

1st. That the said Road shall be made and constructed in strict accordance with the Plans and Specifications now on file in the office of the County Commissioners respectively named. The material used must be of a substantial description, such as earth, gravel, or loam, of which stone may form a component part.

2d. The said Road will be let to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders, by the cubic yard; rick-rapping included.

Proposals will be received by the Commissioners of Perry county, at their office, in Bloomfield, and also at the office of the Commissioners of Dauphin county, in Harrisburg, up to MONDAY, THE 20th DAY OF MAY, at 6 o'clock P. M. 1861. All proposals to be indorsed on a blank specification, which may be had on application to either of said offices, by letter or otherwise. LATEST FROM WASHINGTON. The Secretary of War Opens the Road to Travelers.

APPOINTMENT OF ADJUTANT. GOVERNMENT DECLINES TO RECEIVE ANY MORE TROOPS FOR THREE MONTHS.

GOV. LETCHER ISSUES A PROCLAMATION TO PREPARE FOR WAR.

UNION MEN TRIUMPHANT IN KENTUCKY.

WASHINGTON, May 6, 1861. The Secretary of War in order to accommodate the travelling public has directed the opening of the military route between Washington and Philadelphia by way of Annapolis with two daily trains. Those from the North leaving Philadelphia at 10 o'clock in the morning and 11 o'clock at night.

The Government has appointed Lieut. Nicholson Adjutant and Inspector of the Marine Corps. The Government has declined accepting more than one regiment of three months' volunteers from Michigan; he will, however, receive two regiments under the requirements of the latest proclamation.

Governor Letcher, of Virginia, has issued a proclamation saying that the sovereignty of the Commonwealth of Virginia having been denied, her territorial rights assailed, her soil threatened with invasion by the authorities of Washington, and every sacrifice employed which could influence the people of the northern States; it therefore becomes the solemn duty of every citizen of Virginia to prepare for the impending conflict.

To this end, and for these purposes, and with the determination to repel invasion, Governor Letcher authorizes the Commanding General of the military forces to call and cause to be mustered into service, from time to time, as the public exigencies may require, such additional number of volunteers as he may deem necessary.

The Government has given permission to the Day Line of steamers to carry mails and passengers into Norfolk. No freight, however, is taken. The Southern rebels are forming an encampment at Lynchburg, Va.

The Charleston Courier, received here, is supposed to Jeff. Davis taking the field. It is believed here that the movement of troops to the Relay House is but the preliminary for a movement on Harper's Ferry.

An immense amount of military stores is a riving at the Navy Yard. The volunteer companies of the District of Columbia are to be mustered into regiments for active service.

Two thousand stand of arms that were sent to Baltimore, from Harper's Ferry, by the Secessionists, are to be returned to the Government.

There are now six steamers in the Potomac armed for the protection of transport ships, &c. Gen. Scott decries it stated that he cannot answer one letter in fifty of those that are sent to him, and he hopes no more will be written, soliciting autographs and recommendations to office.

Governor Buckingham, of Connecticut, is here, making arrangements for the troops from the State. The weather continues very disagreeable for military purposes, owing to the cold and the rain.

The New Jersey regiments arrived here this morning all in good order, thus adding several thousand men to the garrison at Washington. The proclamation of the Mayor of Washington, requiring drinking establishments to be closed at half past nine o'clock at night, was issued by the advice of the military authorities.

On Saturday, Senator Wilson suggested to high Executive Officers, that such measures should be adopted, in view of the fact that some of the troops were evidently becoming demoralized by intoxicating liquors.

Much alarm has existed in the neighborhood of the city of Alexandria for the past few days owing to reports that the Federal military command contemplated taking early possession of it. Many families accordingly fled. The Virginia militia proceeded to Culpeper Court House.

The First and Second New Jersey Regiment arrived here early this morning. General Scott publishes another card begging his correspondents to spare him. He says he has no office within his gift—no power to accept of the services of individual volunteers nor of corps of volunteers, and no time to read applications for autographs, and cannot acknowledge the receipt of one letter in fifty.

ANOTHER UNION VICTORY AT THE POLLS. REMOVAL AT LOUISVILLE, KY. LOUISVILLE, May 4. The majority in this city in favor of the Union candidates to the Border State Convention, ranged from 6,000 to 8,000 votes. The Secession ticket was withdrawn some time since.

The Union vote is supposed to be larger than any aggregate vote ever polled here. SENATOR BAYARD PLACARDED. WILMINGTON, May 5. Soon after Senator Bayard arrived here, on Saturday, a placard was posted on a telegraph pole, announcing the arrival of the James A. Bayard, the Prince of the Inner Court of the K. G. G. The Secessionists apparently suspect an attack will be made on the Senator, and it is thought, will take steps to prevent it. Company B, of the Delaware Blues, was mustered into the service of the Union and the other companies are filling up rapidly.

LATEST FROM BALTIMORE. BALTIMORE, May 6. The passage of trains over the Baltimore and Ohio road has not been interrupted by the United States troops at the Relay House. They were engaged in fortifying their position.

THE STEAMSHIP CITY OF BALTIMORE ARRIVED. Breadstuffs Dull. New York, May 6. The steamer city of Baltimore arrived this morning with Liverpool dates to the 24th ult. A prospectus has been issued at Liverpool, with influential support, for a company to run a line of steamers from that port to New Orleans. Another company has been formed for Charleston, and the latter starts its first steamer in July.

A commercial treaty between France and Belgium is said to have been signed at London, by Prince Napoleon, at the instance of a family council, has abandoned the intention of going to England to seek satisfaction from the Duc d'Annamale. Routes are quoted at 68f. 60c., the Bourse closing firm.

The Italian chamber, by a large majority, have agreed to consider Garibaldi's project for arming the country. The ministry voted for the resolution. It is stated that the Pope is more than ever resolved not to quit Rome.
