NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.
SPECIFICATIONS adopted by the County Commissioners of Dauphin and Perry counties, in relation to the construction of a Public Road, as recited in the Act of Assembly, in the following words, to wit:

SECTION 1. That the Commissioners of the several counties of Dauphin and Perry are hereby authorized and instructed, immediately after the passage of this Act, to lay out and construct a good and substantial road, commencing at a point near where the Turnpike Bridge crosses the Susquehanna Canal, in Watts township, Perry county, and running along to the Turnpike Bridge, such distance as will enable them to strike the Turnpike Road towards Dauphin county, near Damascus, Penna., but not to interfere with said Turnpike Road as to obstruct navigation or otherwise.

SECTION 2. That the several counties through which this Road passes will be entitled to pay for the making of only as much of the same as passes through its own territory.

SECTION 3. That the Commissioners of the several counties of Dauphin and Perry are hereby authorized and instructed, immediately after the passage of this Act, to lay out and construct a good and substantial road, commencing at a point near where the Turnpike Bridge crosses the Susquehanna Canal, in Watts township, Perry county, and running along to the Turnpike Bridge, such distance as will enable them to strike the Turnpike Road towards Dauphin county, near Damascus, Penna., but not to interfere with said Turnpike Road as to obstruct navigation or otherwise.

The Governor of Pennsylvania has received from the War Department, at Washington, the following announcement, in reference to the second requisition of militia made by the General Government.

“Ten Regiments are assigned to Pennsylvania, making, in addition to the thirteen regiments of three months already called for, twenty-three regiments. It is important to recruit rather than enlarge this number, and in no event to exceed it.”

Pennsylvania has already furnished to the United States service twenty-five regiments.—Of this number at least ten regiments—the amount of the second requisition—have signified a willingness to change their term of service from three months to three years. No more companies, therefore, from this Commonwealth can now be received for the United States Government.

THE BLOCKADE OF CHARLESTON HARBOUR.
CHARLESTON, May 17.

The Charleston Courier reports that on the 12th inst., the British Bark Hilda from Liverpool was refused entrance into that port by the U. S. steam frigate Niagara. The British ships Monmouth and Gen. Parkill, were also ordered off. The British ship A. was towed up to the city. The British ship Susan G. Owens, bound for Liverpool, was boarded by the Niagara and then permitted to pass.
