II.———— will have charge of the Ordnance Department, and Lieut. Col. John A. Wright will in like manner have charge of the Transportation and Telegraph Department.

III. The chief of the Ordnance Department will receive and receipt for all Ordnance and Ordnance stores required for this corps. It ordinance stores required for this corps. It will be his duty to see that all State property placed under his charge and appertaining to his Department is preserved in condition fit for service. He will issue the same only on requi sitious countersigned by the Commanding General; and he will perform such other duties as may be assigned him in connection with the

Ordnance Department.

IV. To Lieut. Col. John A. Wright, Chief of the Transportation and Telegraph Department, is committed all arrangements and contracts with Deliverships and contracts. tracts with Railroad an I Telegraph companies He will have prepared all necessary forms, and make such arrangements with the different Transportation and Telegraph companies, as will secure a regular and correct settlement of their accounts, and devise and prescribe all regulations requisite to give efficiency to the business of the Department.

V. All orders for the transportation of troops. will be signed by the Commanding General.
