

THE WESTERN VIRGINIA WAR DESPERATE BATTLE AT RICH MOUNTAIN.

FEDERAL TROOPS VICTORIOUS INBLORIOUS RETREAT OF THE REBELS. Sinty Killed and Many Wounded. CAPITURE DE SIX CANNON, HOFSES, WAGONS, ETC.

Our Loss 20 Killed and 40 Wounded.

ROARING RUN, Va., July 12.

A battle was fought yesterday afternoon at Rich Mountain, two miles east of this place, where the enemy, numbering about 2000, under command of Col. Pegram, were strongly entrenched. About three o'clock in the morning and Month river, preventing communication Gen. Rosencrantz, with a portion of the eighth, between lower Maryland and Virginia.
