BY TELEGRAPH. FROM OUR MORNING EDITION. LATEST FROM MANASSAS. A LADY PRISONER RETURNED.

A Large Number of Wounded at the Junction. THE WOUNDED WELL CARED FOR. Large Number of Prisoners Refuse to take the Oath Not to Fight Against the South.

SEVERAL NORTHERN PRISONERS EMPLOYED AS NURSES. MORE THAN 1500 REBELS WOUNDED. Great Preparations at Manassas.

Mrs. Hinsdale, whose husband is a member of the Second regiment, which is now on the Virginia side of the Potomac, has returned from Manassas Junction. She was at Centreville during the engagement on Sunday, and waited there for the return of the soldiers, looking for her husband. Failing to see him she supposed him a prisoner at Manassas. The enemy captured her, and conveyed her thither and employed her as hospital nurse. On Thursday she procured a pass from Gen. Beauregard and his consent to leave. She walked to Alexandria, where she arrived this morning fatigued and exhausted. Her husband was not a prisoner, but returned with his regiment. She reports as being at the Junction a large number of our wounded.

The enemy say they have over 1,000 prisoners. Mrs. H. brings verbal messages from several of their friends, and says that the wounded are well cared for. The offer of liberty has been granted to those who will take the oath not to again take up arms against the Confederates. A few had done so, but the majority refused.

Of the prisoners in the hospital at Henry L. Perrin and Lieut. Underhill, of New York who are employed as hospital stewards; E. F. Taylor, of New Jersey, Surgeon Quarter Master; C. J. Murphy, Dr. Swift, John Bagley and Verdenburg, of the Fourteenth New York are in the hospital; surgeon Cuxton, of the Fifth Maine, and the surgeons of the Thirty-eighth New York, First Minnesota and Third United States unfortunately are prisoners. They were all taken at our hospital near the battle field.

Mrs. Hinsdale says that the Confederates buried their dead as fast as they could be recovered, and that the enemy represented they had but about fifty killed, but their wounded exceed fifteen hundred.

She saw many of our dead unburied as she passed over the battle field, and distinguished some of them by their uniforms. She says the enemy's force is very large at Manassas, and that the officers are very busy drilling and disciplining the troops; that Gen. Beauregard is constantly on the move, going from one part of the camp to the other, and arranging, as they say, for some great movement. She reports that a large force of the enemy is at Fairfax Court House, with heavy guns.

The National Guard Asked to Remain in Baltimore. BALTIMORE July 27. General Dix addressed the members of the National Guard this morning appealing to them for the sake of their country's interests, which demanded every sacrifice at this time, to remain a few days longer at their camp until his arrangements had been perfected. If any of the men had urgent business and domestic calls which would require their immediate personal attention, he would freely grant them passes to Philadelphia, but he would request the regiment to remain until Wednesday next when they would certainly be allowed to return home. After the Gen. had closed this appeal, Col. Lyle put the question, those in the negative to order arms and those in the affirmative to present them. Every arm was presented, and at the instance of the Gen. three rousing cheers were given for the Guard.

Accident at the Navy Yard. GEN. CADWALLADER TO GO INTO ACTIVE SERVICE. COL. FRANKLIN IN COMMAND.

This afternoon an explosion occurred at the navy yard laboratory, by which two men, named Ferguson and Brown, were so badly burned that they died soon afterward.
