WASHINGTON, August 2. SENATE.—The resolution approving of the acts of the President was debated without a vote. tarificially committed supportered to the performance of the Servian national tarificially.

House.-Mr. BINGHAM, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported a substitute for the Senate bill to confiscate the property used for

The substitute was rejected, and Mr. Bragham, (Ohio,) offered an amendment to the bill, subjecting all property employed in resistance to the laws of the United States to capture, wherever found, and that it is the duty of the President to cause the same to be seized, confiscated and condemned. He explained that the Sonate bill applied to all insurrections, while his bill applied to all insurrections, while his amendment restricted the provisions of the bill to the present insurrection.

It proposes that recruiting in any State or territory for service in armed hostility against the United States be considered a high misdemeanor, punishable with a fine of from two to --- thou sand dollars, and imprisonment from one to five years. It punishes similarly, but not to such an extent, those who thus enlist, and those who by words written, or publication, encourage ANOTHER LOT OF THOSE such enlistments. Passed.
