CONSTRUCTION OF WAR VESSELS.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6. The Navy Department is in receipt of a letter from Commander Goldsboro, of the United States Steamer Union, dated Hampton Roads, vesterday, in which he says the brig ashore near Cape Hatteras, about which there was so much speculation, proved to be the B. F. Mertin, of Boston, which had been in the possession of the rebels.

Commander Goldsboro adds that the men vere unloading her, when he sent out a party who, after shelling the place, set fire to the vessel and effectually destroyed her cargo.

It appears by other official advices from the Appointment of a Consul to the Turkish Gulf Squadron that on the fourth of July, off Galveston, the U.S. steamer South Carolina captured six schooners, on the fifth two, and THE AUSTRIAN MISSION. ran one ashore; on the sixth one and on the seventh one, making eleven sail destroyed or captured.

The names of the captured vessels are the Shark, Venus, Ann Rian, McCaulfield, Louisa Dash, Coral, Falcon, George Baker and Sazz Houston: A portion of them had cargoes chiefly of lumber. Among other things captured were thirteen mail bags containing express matter. On the 18th of July off St. Marks, Florida, the Mohawk captured the sloop George B.
