> were taken prisoners. They remained some time at Bull Run and others at Manasses Junction attending upon the wounded for two weeks after the battle, and then were sent to Richmond. Finally they were released on parole and sent within our lines via Norfolk. They have been courteously and kindly treated by the military authorities of the Confederate States, and give a most unqualified denial to all the stories of the killing or ill-treatment of the wounded.

Mrs. Custis, of New York, who went out a day or two after the battle and was taken prisoner is also released. The following men of different regiments

were released and sent home for their kind treatment on the field of battle to Col.
