POOLESVILLE, MD., Sept. 10. Yesterday afternoon the picket guard at Conrad's Ferry discovered a body of rebels at work, which, on inspection with glasses, proved to be the erection of a two gun battery. Word being sent to Gen. Stone's Headquarters, a section of a battery was immediately forwarded. The rebels discharged two shells without effect, when our guns responded with spherical case shot, causing consternation among the rebels and a splendid specimen of racing. The distance between the two batteries was not less

than three quarters of a mile.
