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NUMBERS OF THE ENEMY.

From an official statement just made in the Senate of North Carolina, by ex-Governor Winslow, military secretary, it appears that that state has raised for the war twenty-five regiments and four batteries, embracing in all 20,750 men.

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FROM WASHINGTON.

Official information has been received that the only ports through which cotton ship's bread may be introduced into the island of Cuba free of duty during the time of exemption granted in the royal order of the 16th of May last are Havana, St. Jago de Cuba, Cienfuegos and Nuevitas.

The National Intelligence says: "We believe that the frequent threat of the Richmond batteries along the western shore, have never made any serious impression on our military authorities. There are shells enough at command at any time to enable our vessels to dislodge the rebels along the line."

LATEST FROM LEXINGTON.

Monday afternoon Gen. Price sent word to Col. Mulligan at Lexington, saying, "I am going to hold Lexington until I can get reinforcements. An attack was immediately made by first opening with artillery and then an advance under its cover on the town. Price was repulsed with a heavy loss."

IMPORTANT FROM MISSOURI.

Reliable news from Lexington up to Saturday has been received, and shows that there had been no fight there up to that time, though the Union troops had been summoned to surrender by General Price, whose army was 14,000 strong.

General Price will reinforce Lexington to-morrow, the 18th, with 4,000 men. The correspondent of the Republican says that reliable information has been received that Lexington will hold out on Monday, and had been slightly reinforced.

Another object of this march is said to be to get between our troops at Rolla and other points and prevent junctions with General Price's forces. It will also extend promptly to the aid of our difficult accounts, opening and closing books, general copy work of any kind.
