> THE WINEBERNARIANS IN PITTSBURG-A Female Pastor.—The following, from the Pittsburg Chronicle of yesterday, will interest a large portion of our readers in this locality who are con- DR. DUPONCO'S GOLDEN PILLS FUR FEMALES. nected with the denomination alluded to:

The great mass of our people are innocent of the knowledge that a woman is now pastor of a small but growing congregation in Pittsburg, and is discharging the duties of the sacred office with a zeal and faithfulness worthy of imitation. We refer to Mrs. Beecher, of the Winebrena ian Church. Two months since, this lady, and a few of her followers, rented the old Ashbury Chapel, on Townsend street, near Col well street, Sixth ward, for the purpose of esevening, for preaching, prayer and praise, and large audiences have generally attended, moved more by curiosity, however, than by any other teeling. The labors of the pastor have not been without their reward, for, we are informed, that she has now between thirty and forty communicants. A gentleman from the eastern part of this State, named Hickerwell, assists Mrs. Beecher in her arduous labors. The Winebre-narians are little known, but, though small in numbers, they are entitled, we suppose to, recognition as one of the many divisions into which the Christian church is unhappily sundered. Their doctrines do not differ materially from other evangelical denominations. In worship they resemble the Methodist, but in church government and discipline, the Winebrenarians are different from all others, in their leaving members generally to be governed by their own The prime distinction of this denomination is their practice of "washing the feet" before the pulpit, in presence of the whole congregation
