LATEST NEWS FROM THE UPPER POTOMAC. THE REBEL FORCE AT LEESBURG. CONTRABANDS AND REFUGEES FROM VIRGINIA.

A Fight on the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad. FARMERS, Md., Dec. 31. Contrabands from counties adjacent to the Potomac continue to arrive daily...

Advices from Dicks' No. 5, this morning, inform us that the rebels' made a demonstration yesterday and fired several shot and shell at the Dam and our men from their 12-pound rifled gun...

While the enemy of late have only shown one gun, the 12-pounder Parrot cannon, it is well known that they have in the vicinity of Leesburg a full field battery, which is probably masked in some place where they anticipate we are to pass, should an advance be made.
