FROM WASHINGTON. Additional Clerks in the War Department. Fifty Millions of Treasury Notes to be Issued.

XXXVIIth Congress--First Session. IN SENATE. Mr. COWAN (Pa.) introduced petitions for the employment of Homeopathic physicians in the army.

Mr. DIXON (Conn.) presented the petition of Benjamin Silliman, Ellis Loomis and others, asking for the continuance of the coast survey.

Mr. WADSWORTH (Ohio) introduced a bill authorizing the Secretary of War to appoint one or more Assistant Secretaries. The bill provides for the employment of such assistants for one year.

Mr. WADSWORTH also introduced a bill to promote the administration of justice. The bill repeals the act of March 3, 1857, which provided for the examination by Congressional Committees of the examination in a court of justice.

Mr. CLARK (N. H.) introduced a bill to authorize the payment of rent for property occupied by troops of the United States. Referred.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. William A. Hall, Representative from the First Congressional District of Missouri, appeared and was sworn.

Also, a resolution, which was adopted, that pending the discussion of the above subject, Mr. Segar be permitted to occupy a seat on the floor and have leave to address the House on the merits of the question.

Mr. KELLOGG (Ill.) made an adverse report on the bill for the more convenient and effective enforcement of the laws to keep the peace and secure good behavior. Laid on the table.

Mr. KELLOGG (Ill.) introduced a bill authorizing the Secretary of the Treasury to settle with the States for supplies furnished their respective troops.

Mr. DIXON (Conn.) introduced a bill to establish an additional Judicial District in New York, and in relation to the United States Courts in that State. Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

Mr. ALLEN (Ohio) offered a resolution, that in the judgment of the House, no part of the appropriation now or hereafter made, nor of taxes now or hereafter to be laid by Congress, shall be used in or applied to the prosecution of a war for the emancipation of slaves in the slaveholding States of the Union.

Mr. WADSWORTH (Ohio) introduced a bill to amend an act of Congress, approved July 1, 1857, relating to the repeal of existing laws. Referred to the Committee on Commerce.

Mr. WADSWORTH (Ohio) introduced a resolution directing the sergeant-at-arms to bring before the bar of the House Benj. Hickley for alleged contempt of authority in not appearing before the committee as a witness at the time they held a meeting in Cincinnati.

Mr. WRIGHT remembered that he was returned here as a representative by both political parties, who agreed upon a common platform. He was elected as a Union man, and as such he was ready to stand or fall.
