From the Forty-Sixth Penn'a. Regiment.
HANOOK, Jan. 19.

Mr. Editor—We have been so busily engaged in changing quarters and receiving the kind and ever welcome attentions of paymaster Sherman, that I have been unable to write earlier concerning our march from Frederick to Williamsport via Hagerstown, and our subsequent arrival at the "deserted village" of Hancock.

Leaving our camp, near Frederick on Monday morning, January sixth. Just before daylight we were joined by the nineteenth and twenty-eighth New York, and fifth Connecticut regiments—all belonging to the brigade of General Williams—our regiment taking the advance.

On Tuesday morning at ten o'clock we were again formed, every man being in his place, and started for Williamsport, having been detached from our brigade and ordered to report to Col. Leonard of the thirtieth Massachusetts, acting Brigadier-General, where we arrived at noon, distance seven miles.

On Friday morning we received the very cheering news that we were again to join our brigade, and by eight o'clock were under way. Marched steadily and reached a small place called Clear Spring, and starting from there on Saturday morning at an early hour, arrived in Hancock about 3 o'clock, just as it began raining severely.

On Sunday morning rumors were current that the Confederates would probably make an attack upon us, companies were ordered to stay in quarters, and every precaution of "lively times" was apparent.
