From Fort Donelson. BURNING OF THE TENNESSEE **BOLLING MILLS.** GEN. GRANT'S ORDER RELA-TIVE TO PLUNDERING. CAPTURE OF THE REBEL MAILS. Cowardly Action of Floyd's Brigade. THEY THROW THEIR ARMS INTO THE RIVER. 14 FORT DOWNLOON, Feb. 17. 'lhe great fire which was seen up the river last night, was the burning of the Tennessee rolling mills, four miles from here, by our gunboats The works had been used by the reb ls in the manufacture of shot, shell, and other materials of war, and was an extensive concern. Gen. Grant has promulgated the most stringent order against plundering from inhabitants and against stealing the property taken in the battle. Before the surrendering the rebels threw most of their late mulls into the river. Col. Markland, postal director, however, succeeded in seizing a number of mail bags and some outside latters supposed to contain important information. Floyd's brigade, fearing that they might be taken, threw all their arms, which were Minnie rifles of the best kind, into the river. The rews of our gunboats are engaged in fishing them out. Capt. Dixon, rebel chief artillery engineer, who constructed the fortification, was killed in the bombardment of Friday, in one of his own batteries. CAIRO, Feb. 21.-It is now believed that a port on of the rebel prisouers will be sent to Alton and all the others to Chicago, Fort Wayne and Detroit. From Cairo. ACTIVE MOVEMENT OF TROOPS. The Rebels Prisoners Anxious to Take up Arms Against the South ADDITIONAL CASUALITIES. CAIRO, Feb. 19. Troops are constantly arriving and departing for the seat of war. It is believed, if permitted to do so, many of the rebel prisoners would gladly 'take up arms on the side of the Union. Numbers of privates declare they have seen enough of recession.
