SENATE.

Tuesday, March 11, 1882.

The Senate convened at 11 o'clock A. M., and was called to order by Speaker HALL. The journal of yesterday (Monday), was partly read, when...

On motion of Mr. LOWRY, the further reading of the same was dispensed with. The SPEAKER called the attention of the sergeant-at-arms, and three officers acting under him, to the more strict enforcement of the twenty-fifth rule of the Senate.

MANASSAS EVACUATED. Mr. LOWRY obtained leave to make a statement as follows: I hold in my hand a telegraphic dispatch to the Governor, which by his permission I will read.

MANASSAS IS EVACUATED, and our army has taken peaceful possession. The whole army is in motion. [Applause.]
