Miscellaneous. Election Proclamation. IN compliance with the charter of the city of Harrisburg, notice is hereby given to the qualified voters of the several wards of the said city...

In the First ward—the qualified voters will meet at the School House on the corner of Front street and Mary's alley, in said city, and vote for one member of Common Council, one person for Constable, one person for Assessor, one person for Judge, and two persons for Inspectors of election, in said ward; and School Directors.

In the Second ward—the qualified voters will meet on said day at the School House on the corner of Dewberry alley and Chestnut street, and elect one person for Common Council, one person for Constable, one person for Assessor, one person for Judge, and two persons for Inspectors of election, in said ward; and School Directors.

In the Third ward—the qualified voters will meet on said day at the School House, corner of Walnut street and River alley, in said city, and vote for one person for Common Council, one person for Constable, one person for Assessor, one person for Judge, and two persons for Inspectors of election, in said ward; and School Directors.

In the Fourth ward—the qualified voters will meet on said day at the School House in West State street, and vote for one person for Common Council, one person for Constable, one person for Assessor, one person for Judge, and two persons for Inspectors of election, in said ward; and School Directors.

In the Fifth ward—the qualified voters will meet on said day, at the dairy of John Foster, corner of Ridge road and North avenue, and vote for one person for member of Common Council, one person for Constable, one person for Assessor, one person for Judge, and two persons for Inspectors of election of said ward; and School Directors.

In the Sixth ward—the qualified voters will meet at the School House on Broad street west of Ridge avenue, and vote for one person for Constable, one person for Assessor, one person for Judge, and two persons for Inspectors of election, in said ward; and School Directors.
