DANGEROUS COUNTERFEIT. -Thompson's Bank Note Reporter, for March 1st, warns the public against the ingenious and very dangerous counterfeit of ten dollar gold pieces, which are circulated extensively, and almost dely detection from an expert. A PLEA FOR THE CANAL.—The amount of freight pressing on the Pennsylvania railroad at Pittsbug, has, in some measure, directed public attention to the canal as a means of transportation between there and Philadelphia, and it is urged that with proper facilities the greater part of the oil sent east from the oil districts might be forwarded by this route. The Philadelphia North American, in an article on the subject, urges that additional means of transportion be provided on the Allegheny river, and suggests that as the oil reaches Pittsburg it be shipped east by the canal. It says: "Canal transportation being less costly than that by railway, the oil could be made a steady and reliable business for the old canal from Pittsburg DR. east, if the company now owning it would give encouragement for that purpose.
