BILL FOR THE SUPPRESSION OF BAWDY HOUSES -Senator Irish has read in place an act for the suppression of bawdy houses. It enacts that any person or persons who shall keep or maintain such houses, and shall refuse to deliver up to the owner possession of the premises occupled for such illegal purposes after ten days' notice and demand served on the premises, shall and may be removed and ejected, using so much force as is necessary to that end; and the fact that the premises were used for the said improper practices shall be a full and complete defence to any prosecution, action or suits instituted for, or on account of any such removal or ejectment.
