

He then considered the legal aspect of the bill, and discussed the principles of common law, which were opposed to it—the same general legal principles which prevented violations of flags of truce, shooting or mali-treating of prisoners, poisoning of wells or food left to the enemy, or hanging of rebels that might lead to cruel retailations, would

prevent such a law as this. He dwelt at great length on constitutional objec-tions to the bill, reading and commenting on the various sections relating to treason as not warranting any such legislation as this pro-posed. He alluded to the ability and efficiency in times of peace and war, of the Constitution and its supremacy over every class of law in-cluding martial law. The bill condemned property without trial by jury or any judicial proceedings, and when the rights of trial by jury was overthrown, liberty had filed the cona-try. It was clearly a bill of attainder in the meaning of the Constitution, and he be-lieved it was likewise expost. facto in supporting these positions he quoted a number of legal decisions. He contended that Con-gress had no right to free the slaves, no more than to confiscate the jewelry in the land. Without concluding the Senate went into

executive session, and subsequently adjourned.
