HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. 'Mr. Washburns, (III.;) from the Committee on Commerce, reported a bill granting power to the Secretary of the Trea-ury additional to those conferred by the bill of the 13th of July last, providing for the collection of duties on

The bill was passed. It provides that if any vessel or other vehicle shall be refused a clearance or permit by the Secretary of the Treasury or by his order, and shall proceed to any foreign or domestic port, it shall be forfeited to the United States. When clearances or permits shall be granted, bonds may be required in the penalty equal to the value of the vessel and cargo for any adherence to the conditions annexed, the cargo shall be delivered at the port of destination, and no part thereof used to give aid and comfort to any part of the country in insurrection against the United States. The scoretary is further empowered to prohibit the importation of goods, wares and merchandize into any part of the United States over any railroad or turnpike, whenever there is satisfactory reason to believe that the goods are for the use of the insurgents, or may fall into their posses.

The Secretary is authorized to make such general or special regulations as may be passed to carry into effect the purpose of this act. If these rules are violated, or an attempt is made to violate them, the goods shall be forfeited to the United States. The penalties may be nesections of the act of July last, to which the bill is supplementary; all penalties and forfei-tures to be disposed of as required by act of March, 1709, regulating the duties on imports and tonoage.
