The legislation of Congress is almost exclusively with regard to the negro. They have abolished slavery here, and to the contrabands rations are daily distributed.

White men are required to procure passes to enter our lines but negroes can enter them without such passes. He asked, was it the purpose of the majority here to make the negroes the equals of the whites.

He repeated that the legislation of Congress had been disastrous. Look at an instance in Tennessee, over which had been placed a Governor, Popular and energetic, with fair administrative abilities.
