Latest from Frederick. A gentleman, who left Frederick yesterday at noon, reports the most perfect quiet and good order as prevailing in the city.

THE GUARDS OF THE REBELS, The latest intelligence from Frederick indicates that the main body of the rebel army, after passing out on the Emmitsburg road some ten miles, took a road to the right leading to Hagerstown.

THE MOVEMENT OF THE REBELS SO FAR TOWARDS BALTIMORE, considered in the stationing of thirty-six picket guard yesterday within seven miles of Westminster, which caused a very general stampede of the citizens from that town.
