The Telegraph. TO ARMS! TO ARMS! PENNSYLVANIA INVADED. One Hundred Thousand Men Wanted.

The Governor issued another proclamation last evening, calling for FIFTY THOUSAND of the freemen of Pennsylvania, to repel the invasion of our State.

THE SITUATION. A reliable man just returned from Frederick informs us that he was in Frederick on the 10th of September, Tuesday, and that the rebels broke up their encampments at half-past one o'clock that morning, and marched in the direction of Hagerstown; Stonewall Jackson leading. He saw them marching from their numerous encampments from 5 A. M. to 9 P. M., the time he left Frederick.

LATER. Since the foregoing was received, reliable information has been obtained that Stonewall Jackson with his advance is now in Hagerstown, preparing to move with the whole army on Pennsylvania.

THE NORTHERN CENTRAL RAILROAD. We learn that all the bridges on this road are being strongly protected, and that troops are being posted along the roads leading to it.
