The Publication of Army Movements.

HEADQUARTERS OF THE ARMY, WASHINGTON, Sept. 19.

Major General S. G. Foster, commanding the Department of North Carolina, has called attention to an article in the New York Evening Post of September 10th, in which are published the numbers and positions of his troops.

He remarks that New York papers always reach the enemy a few days after their publication, and that such information from our friends is more injurious than gained by the rebel spies.

The newspaper press is earnestly requested to make no publication in regard to the numbers or movements of our troops.

No information could be more desirable to the enemy than this. Such publications have done immense injury to our cause.

LARGE FIRE AT BUFFALO.

BUFFALO, Sept. 19.

At one o'clock this morning a fire broke out in the brick building, corner of Water and North streets, used as a grain drying house.

The fire spread rapidly to the Evans & Sterling's elevator, which, with their contents, were destroyed.

The fire then crossed Nolens street, communicating to Bell's foundry, Klein's, Deacon's pump and block factory, and a number of tenement houses on Evans, Eby and Leocadia streets, all of which were burned.

David Bell's loss is estimated at \$50,000 to \$70,000. The loss of Evans is not known, but probably reaches a half million of dollars.

Some thirty forty buildings were destroyed. The elevators contained 18,872 bushels of wheat, 14,000 bushels of corn, and 23,900 bushels of oats.
