The Telegraph, OUR HOSPITALS. - The public will be gratified to learn that there is an abundant supply of hospital stores on hand for the use of the sick and wounded soldiers now in this vicinity.

From all parts of the state boxes and bundles and barrels filled with all manner of useful articles for the sick and wounded have been arriving at this place, addressed to the care of Quarter Master General Hale.

All articles actually necessary for the sustenance and shelter of the inmates of the hospital are furnished by the government. Rather, we should say, that the government places abundant stores of this kind at the disposal of those entrusted with the care of the sick and wounded.

Could those who have forwarded these gifts witness the gratitude with which they are received, and hear the touching expressions that fall from the lips of these sufferers, they would feel a thousand times repaid for all the efforts they have put forth in their behalf.

In addition to the above mentioned assorted supplies, there are yet on hand several wagon loads of unopened boxes, which will shortly be examined and their contents arranged as above.

Arrangements were being made for sending a large portion of these supplies, under the care of a judicious person, to be distributed among the farm houses in the vicinity of the late battle field; but upon careful inquiry, this had been found to be unnecessary, as appears from the following letter:

Dear Brother: - When I sent a recent dispatch, I thought we needed blankets, shirts and drawers, but I have this day visited a number of the hospitals in the farm houses around the battle field, and learn that the supply of these articles is ample.

It may be asked, is there, then, nothing more that we can do for these soldiers? Yes; there is lack of wrappers, woolen socks, carpet slippers and handkerchiefs. The cold weather is coming on, and such articles will be greatly needed.
