

To PRESERVE CIDER. --- The Prairie Farmer says the following receipt for preserving cider was tested last fall by a friend, and found to be all that is claimed for it : When the cider in the white sugar as will be equal to a quarter or three quarters of a pound to each gallon of cider, according as the apples are sweet or sour, let the formentation proceed until the liquid has the tasts to suit, then add a quarter of an ounce to each gallon of cider, shake well and let it stand three days, and bottle for use.
